C4 – BS EN Standards

Requirements for ready mixed concrete, mortar and cement are specified in a series of BS EN Standards that were introduced to comply with the EU Construction Products Directive.

Whilst the important characteristics of concrete, mortar and cement used in the UK have not changed, the new Standards describe them in a different way to established practice. Different test methods have also given different compliance criteria.

Ready-mixed concrete

Ready-mixed concrete is specified using:

BS EN 206-1	Concrete - Part 1: Specification, performance, production and conformity
BS 8500-1	Concrete – Complementary British Standards to BS EN 206-1 Part 1: Method for specifying and guidance for the specifier
BS 8500-2	Concrete - Complementary British Standards to BS EN 206-1 Part 2: Specification for constituent materials and concrete.
BS EN 206-1 and BS 8500 replaced all the parts of:	
BS 5328	Concrete, Methods for specifying concrete mixes

Factory produced mortar

Factory produced mortar is specified using:

BS EN 998 Specification for mortar for masonry

This BS EN Standard is published as two Parts:

BS EN 998-1 Part 1: Rendering and plastering mortar

BS EN 998-2 Part 2: Masonry mortar

Mortars used in floor screeds are specified in a separate Standard:

BS EN 13813 Screed material and floor screeds – properties and requirements

Guidance on the use of BS EN 998-2 is published by BSI as:

PD 6678 Guide to the selection and specification of masonry mortar

BS EN 998 replaced the established British (BS) Standard:

BS 4721 Specification for ready-mixed building mortar

Cement

Most cement used in the UK is specified in:

BS EN 197-1 Cement. Composition, specifications and conformity criteria for common cements

There is a separate Standard for cement used in masonry:
