S32 – Toolbox Talk Open Bodies of Water & Lagoons

The major hazards that must be considered when working on open bodies of water and lagoons are:

- → Drowning, and
- → Structural failure of the lagoon.
- → Never work on or close to a silt pond without permission from your manager
- → Never work alone
- → Always wear a life vest when working near or on silt ponds, pontoons or other lagoon areas
- → Where a safety boat is provided, check the equipment at the start of each shift
- → Always make sure that you know the location of the nearest life buoy and rescue rope
- → Ensure you are familiar with emergency drills
- Always pay attention to the buoyancy and stability of pump pontoons when working on them. Working platforms must be properly constructed including toe-boards and guard rails. Ladders should be lashed
- → Lighting must be adequate for night work and must illuminate the immediate surrounding water surface
- Check that access gates to silt ponds areas are closed and locked at the end of each working day
- Report any seepage from the sides or toe of retaining bunds to your supervisor immediately
- → Never allow any solid material other than silt or pit waste to enter any silt pond
- → Always keep weirs and overflows free from obstructions
